Three Things about Me Family Activity

Give each family member a piece of paper and a pencil. Invite them to write down three things about themselves. Two of them should be true; one of them should be false. You may have to help younger kids who can't write or who may have trouble thinking of three things.

Collect all the papers when everyone is done. Pass them back out, ensuring no one got their own paper. Starting with the youngest family member, have each person read their "facts" out loud and try to guess whose paper they have. Once they guess correctly, try to guess which thing is not true.

It is fairly easy when you know each other so well to recognize whose "facts" were whose and which ones were false. This is a fun game you can play with friends and family members over the phone or other mode of connection, too! I Believe What I Can't See

Suggested talking points are in **bold**, answers are *italicized*.

This is a word scramble with a secret phrase to fill in at the end. Kids will unscramble the words in the parentheses, filling in the blanks in each sentence. Then they will use the code numbers to discover the phrase at the end.

Besides Jesus, are there things we can't see but believe in anyway? Allow some answers. We're going to do a word puzzle to find things that we believe even though we can't see them.

At the end of each sentence on the page, there is a scrambled word. Let's try to figure out each word that fits in the blanks.

This is an activity that would be best done as a group. As the words are unscrambled, talk briefly about how it is that we believe in each thing, even though we can't see it.

Now, at the bottom of the page is a special message. We're going to match up the numbers with the letters from the sentences above and see what our special phrase is. Work on this together. Can anyone remember who said, "My Lord and my God!" in our story? (*Thomas*) When did he say that? (*when Jesus showed him his hands and side*) What was Thomas doing when he said those words? (*He was worshiping Jesus and showing his faith.*)
